





MVP Calculation and Eligibility

How is MVP Calculated?

MVP is determined by the number of points earned divided by the number of points available (PA).

Example for 8-Ball:

- In every 8-Ball match, there are 3 points available to win.
- If you play 10 matches, you have 30 points available to win (3 x 10).
- If you win a total of 13 points in those 10 matches, the calculation is:
- $13 \div 30 = 0.43$ or 43%.
- This means you won 43% of the points available (PA) during the session.

Example for 9-Ball:

- In every 9-Ball match, there are 20 points available to win.
- If you play 10 matches, you have 200 points available to win (20 x 10).
- If you win a total of 162 points in those 10 matches, the calculation is:
- 162 ÷ 200 = 0.81 or 81%.
- This means you won 81% of the points available (PA) during the session.

Breaking Ties

Unless otherwise stipulated in the Local Bylaws, ties will be broken in the following order:

- 1. Total number of matches played.
- 2. Win percentage.
- 3. Performance points.
- 4. Lifetime win percentage.

MVP List and Eligibility

- The top 10 players within your Division Tier (or just Division if not tiered) will be displayed on the MVP List.
- Players must play 7 matches with their team to become eligible for MVP standings and awards, unless otherwise stipulated in the Local Bylaws.

MVP Tiers

The MVP Program is divided into several tiers based on players' skill levels. Make sure you are looking at your individual skill level tier when locating your standing.
